From the Personnel Committee

The following letter is a revision of our letter which originally appeared in this Record. Unintentionally, a paragraph of the first letter and some other statements could be read to say that the Personnel Committee did not think we currently have any children's ministry happening at TBC and that hiring a Minister of Children will be the beginning of children's ministry at Tabernacle. We certainly do not believe that and greatly appreciate and value the tremendous work with children that is currently being done by our volunteers and staff. We already have an effective ministry with children but realize that we are expecting our volunteers to also spend time planning and organizing a ministry that is beyond the time that can be reasonably expected of volunteers. Our hope is to give the children's ministry a "go to" person on staff who can support and enhance the ministry that is already happening without burning out our seemingly tireless volunteers. Please accept our apology for this unintended errant statement in the first letter and any confusion or hurt it may have caused.

As the 2010 year begins with thoughts of resolutions and beginning new traditions, your Personnel Committee also looks forward to further accomplishments and goals for 2010. This committee has been a busy one at Tabernacle over the past few years (with the addition of our Minister of Youth, Groundskeeper, Associate Pastor – Minister of Music, Minister of Counseling and Spiritual Formation) and our Pastor (with great thanks to our Pastor Search Committee). This coming year offers even more work on our part. We have attained goals by filling staff positions as requested by the congregation. With the Lord's leading, we have been at work in accomplishing goals set by you as our congregation through VTT; however, one position remains to be filled – that of Minister of Children.

We seem to be hitting the same roadblock each time we feel that we are about to fulfill our goal in offering the position of Minister of Children to a viable candidate. That comes down to the reality of: compensation. As the budget for 2010 was developed, our committee did not increase the amount allocated for this position from previous projections (\$7800 for the year; 10 hours per week at \$15 per hour). As the job description for this position is further defined, we realize that it will take more hours to accomplish than anticipated. Merely being at church during Sunday and Wednesday services will fill the hours allocated. This does not include time that will be involved for planning and coordinating the Children's Programs, the implementation of these programs (along with our dedicated children's ministry volunteers), and nurturing our present families and outreach to prospective and visiting families.

The Church in Conference voted at the November meeting to give the Personnel Committee time on **Sunday, January 17, at 9:00 a.m. (this will take the place of Sunday School)** to meet with the congregation to further explain the importance of this position and the committee's view of the job responsibilities involved. We have very dedicated group of workers who work tirelessly and effectively with our children and families. Most of these workers are volunteers and unselfishly give of their time to provide a place for children and families in our church. It is our belief, and the church's position through our extensive visioning process, that a Minister of Children will provide the extra support and affirmation that our volunteers and Children's Ministry need to be even more effective in shaping the spiritual life of children and families.

It is our hope that you will be willing to invest in our future in the following way: dedicating an amount beyond your monthly projected commitment to TBC's stewardship budget. If only 25 giving units gave an additional \$26 per month dedicated to this position, our goal could be accomplished. If 50 units gave only \$13 additionally per month, our goal could be accomplished. We could then offer employment to a Minister of Children for 20 hours per week (as that of our Minister of Youth). We believe that this contribution (above normal projected donations) will need to be promised for only two years before the growing congregation will be able to support the continuation of this position. In other words, we believe that filling this position will further support children and families, both present and future, and help us grow our ministry in the northwest area of Raleigh.

We urge you to be present on **Sunday, January 17 at 9:00 a.m. (in place of Sunday School hour)** to show your support of our efforts in hiring a Minister of Children. We urge you to be present on **Sunday, January 17** to encourage others in support of the above goals. Your Personnel Committee loves and supports you as a congregation and wants to fulfill your goals/our needs.

CHANGES IN COOPERATIVE GIVING

As was discussed at the November 2009 Church Conference, cooperative giving plans are changing, effective January 1, 2010. This change is due to the decision of the Baptist State Convention (BSC) at their November 2008 convention to eliminate giving plans A, B, and C. This change has no impact on the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship of North Carolina Missions Resource Plan (CBFNC-MRP). Beginning with your January 2010 offering envelopes, revised giving options are the **CBFNC-Missions Resource Plan** and the **Baptist State Convention Cooperative Program**.

This change should have no affect on those who have designated cooperative giving through the BSC Plans A and B or the CBFNC-MRP. Those who have designated cooperative giving through the BSC Plan C will need to make a decision. The BSC Plan C allotted 10% of plan giving to the national Cooperative Baptist Fellowship and nothing to Cooperative Baptist Fellowship of North Carolina. The remaining 90% was allotted to the Baptist State Convention and Baptist ministry partners. The Baptist State Convention provides no support to WMU or NC Baptist Retirement Homes and will cease to support NC Baptist higher education as of January 1, 2012.

The CBFNC-Missions Resource Plan allots 20% to the national Cooperative Baptist Fellowship and 30% to the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship of North Carolina. The remaining 50% supports traditional Baptist ministry partners, which include WMU and NC Baptist Retirement Homes and NC Baptist higher education. Contributors through the former Plan C who wish to continue to support both the BSC and CBFNC-Missions Resource Plan can alternate their designations (i.e. giving through CBFNC-Missions Resource
